

Sharps Awareness Training

Over 29 million needles a year are issued to addicts in the UK, 20 million of which are never returned. Discarded needles are found in homes, parks and playing fields, public toilets, footpaths, car parks, school grounds, communal entrances, and gardens.



The Risks

- Up to 10% of discarded needles can be infected with active Hepatitis B or C Virus.
- Other potential infections from needlestick injury include HIV and West Nile Virus.
- Tidy Britain recorded 226 injuries from discarded needles in a 3 year period. 60% of these were local government employees.
- Risk is higher for those carrying out work such as cleansing or grounds maintenance, where they are more likely to come into contact with discarded needles.
